SEU Link Southeastern University

Research-Based Practices to Improve Students' Independent Living and Self-Advocacy

As program director of the SEU Link Program, I am blessed to see dramatic changes in our students from the first semester to the final semester. Some of those changes are easy to measure, such as whether a student becomes employed after graduation. Other skills, such as independent living and self-advocacy, are more difficult to calculate. In order to measure the effectiveness of our 2-year postsecondary transition program on independent living and self-advocacy skills, we developed a survey for students, their parents, and their peer mentors. Data were collected at 3 points in time: the beginning of the first year, the end of the first year and the end of the second year. Participants rated the students' skills in 3 contexts: campus, community and employment. Each item was measured on a 5point Likert scale (Always, Usually, Unsure, Sometimes, or Never).


