Meet Sebastian Munoz, Ft. Myers Technical College, holding his acceptance letter to the National Tech Honor Society

Sebastian Munoz began his program in January of 2022 and will graduate in June of 2023. Sebastian was the first FPCTP student to be inducted into the National Tech Honor Society in May, 2022!!!! In order to be considered for eligibility, Sebastian had to demonstrate a strong commitment to his studies as evident by attendance at 93%, a 3.0 or higher GPA, and feedback from his instructor.

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Sebastian was working in a local restaurant, The Standard, where he chopped vegetables, prepared side dishes, and occasionally bussed tables when he decided to enroll in Ft. Myers Technical College's HIRE Program. His goal is to have the training, skills, and credentials in the Culinary Arts necessary to obtain his dream job of working in the kitchen at a local Olive Garden. Sebastian has a gift for pasta and makes the best shrimp fettucine around! The HIRE Program Coordinator, Christian Zimmerman, has already contacted the manager at the two local Olive Gardens and they cannot wait to have him on their team.

<u>Program Highlight:</u> <u>Supporting the Mental Health of</u> <u>FPCTP Students</u>

As leaders of postsecondary, inclusive education programs for students with an intellectual disability, we have excelled at providing a comprehensive educational experience and independent living learning opportunities. However, very often we exclude an important component of the student's disability.

According to an article by Kerim M.Munir published in 2016, "the prevalence of ID/IDD is around 1-3%, and co-occurring mental ill-health is around 40%, with persistent mental ill-health around 30%." The article states that only 1 in 10 youth receive mental health services, with these co-occurring disorders occurring across the lifespan. Additionally, the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, recognizes mental health disorders as a psychosocial disabilities (A Psychosocial Disability involves actual or perceived impairment due to a diversity of mental, emotional, or cognitive experiences.) Therefore, it is incumbent on the leadership of all post-secondary education programs to embed a mental health component throughout their programs.
