Project TOPS at Robert Morgan Educational Center & Technical College started in 2015 with funding from the Florida Developmental Disabilities Council (FDDC) in collaboration with the Miami-Dade County Public Schools' Office of Adult Education. In 2017, TOPS received funding from the Florida Center for Students with Unique Abilities (FCSUA) and became the first FPCTP program in Miami Dade County. This accomplishment comes with enormous responsibility to all stakeholders – especially the young adults who enroll in the program.

TOPS is a career technical education (CTE) model for students with documented intellectual disabilities or intellectual disabilities with other co-existing disabilities who have identified a CTE area of interest. Can students with unique abilities be successful in a CTE academic environment? Absolutely! The greatest indicator of success is the student's awareness about the requirements and clear expectations of the CTE program.
