Students with intellectual disabilities attending Florida Postsecondary Comprehensive Transition Programs (FPTCPs) earn meaningful credentials. Many of the programs lead to industry certification in a variety of career fields, including, but not limited to, automotive, construction, culinary, technology, and more.

- There are 9 FPCTPs located at technical colleges and 4 FPCTPS at state colleges.
- One hundred fortythree students have enrolled in FPCTPs at technical colleges.
- To date, 43 students have completed their certification programs.




