Role of the Peer Mentor

- Primarily social
- Expand the student's "circle"
- Encourage participate in clubs and activities
- Model positive, age appropriate behaviors

Mentor Selection

- Initial advertising, eventually word of mouth
- Application, references
- Interview with mentor coordinator
 - Grades, availability, interest

Mentor Training

- Initial Training, Monthly Meetings
- The Role of the Peer Mentor
- Peer Mentoring Do's and Don'ts
- Professional Ethics for Peer Mentors
- Establishing Rapport & Motivating Mentees
- Questioning and Listening Skills
- Campus & Community Resources & Referrals

Mentor Evaluation

- Student evaluates mentor
- Mentor self-evaluates (reflects) and evaluates program
- Coordinator provides monitoring and evaluation

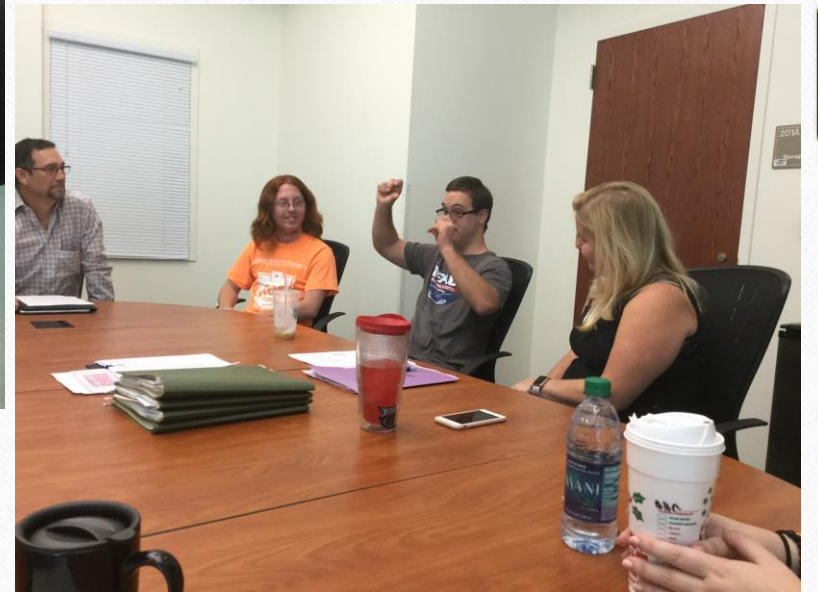
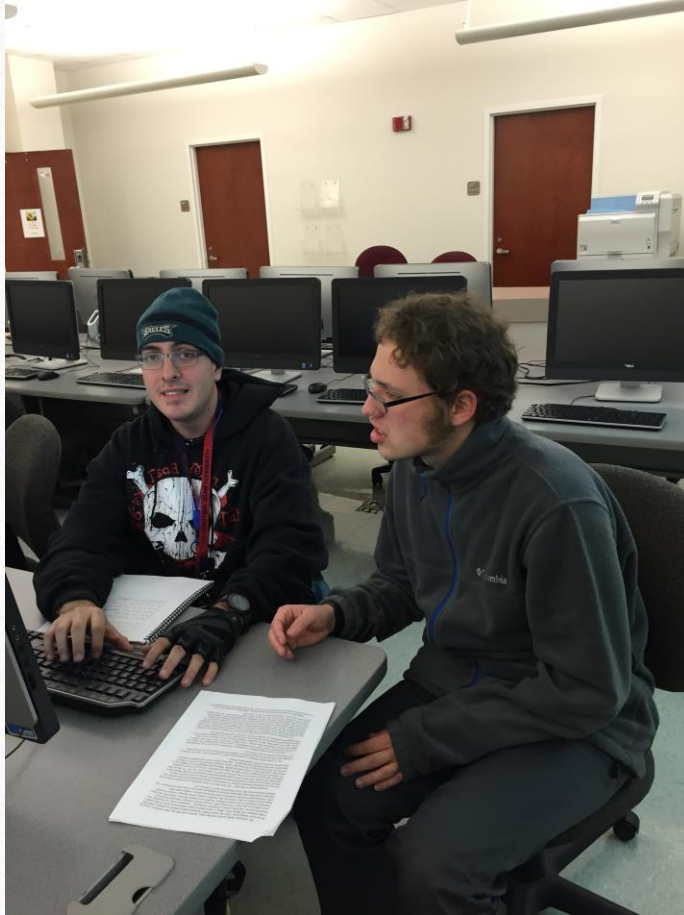

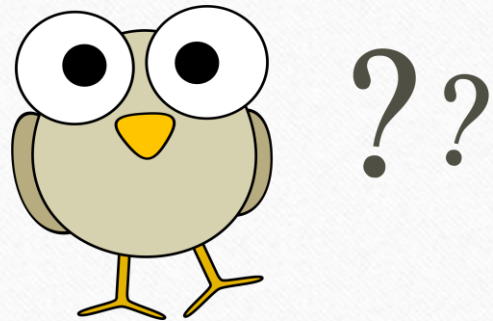
